As the Company needs further funds to enhance its business operations, upgrade the efficiency and to meet out the deficiencies in working capital, the Directors do not recommend any dividend on Equity Shares for the financial year 2023-24.

3. 3. Summary of significant accounting policies.

A. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles requires. The management has made estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period. Long-term investments are stated at cost. Provision for diminution in the value of long term investment is made only if, such a decline is other than temporary in the opinion of the management. The Current investments are stated at lower of cost or quoted/fair vale market value computed category wise.

E. Fixed ,Intangible Assets & Borrowing Cost

(i) Fixed Assets are stated at their original cost, less provision for impairment losses, if any ,depreciation , amortization and adjustments on account of foreign exchange fluctuations in respect of changes in rupee liability of foreign currency loans used for acquisition of fixed assets.

(ii)There is no Intangible Assets.

F. Depreciation & Amortization

Adjustment of deferred tax liability attributable to change in tax rate is shown in the statement of profit and loss as a part of the deferred tax adjustment for the year.

J. Provisions and Contingent Liabilities

Provision are recognized for present obligations, of uncertain timing or amount, arising as a result of a past event where a reliable estimate can be made and it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. 
